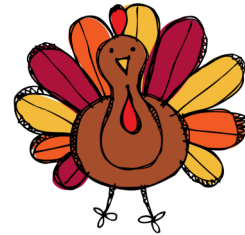

## OUTSIDE PLAY

Due to state licensing rules we are required to take all children outside 2 times per day weather permitting. If the “feels like” temperature is above 0 we go outside. It’s a lot of work getting children dressed for outside play and to keep all needed items on while outside.



We encourage all parents to practice these skills at home too! Have your child put on their own snowpants, boots, coats, hats and mittens. Be sure to give them extra time to practice these skills on their own. They can learn to zip their own coats too at a young age. Once we are outside, it can be a struggle to keep on hats and mittens. It would be great for all kids to have these skills mastered by the time they start kindergarten!

Parents and older siblings can model this at home by playing outside together on weekends and holidays! Plus, FRESH AIR is good for all of us, even when it’s cold and snowy!
